

- Student Management system Software is developed by I-NET Solutions, Chennai, and the software is installed in our college to help the parents to view the academic details of their wards' attendance, University marks, and Last date for the payment of fees (Hostel fees, bus fees, semester fees) and other details through internet.
- A separate user ID and password is provided to the parents to view the above details of their wards'.
- Necessary information like time table, reopening date etc is sent to the mobile number of the students/parents immediately.
- Soft skills, communication skills and aptitude training are given to the students to face the interview and get placed in various MNCs
- Honour the students with the cash award of Rs.2000/- for getting centum in the University examination.
- Our Department of Computer Science has developed software which is installed in our office computers for giving Bonafide Certificate, Bonafide Certificate for Bus pass concession, Study Certificate, No Objection Certificate, Fees Certificate [Income tax & Bank loan], Conduct Certificate, Attendance Certificate, and Course Completion Certificate, imprinted with the students' photograph for the benefit of the students.
- Encourage them by providing the registration fee and Travelling Allowance for winning prizes in various intercollegiate meet & Seminars/Symposiums/Workshops etc.,.
- Award cash prizes of Rs 2000 for students who qualified in the professional auditing courses like CA, ICWA, and ACS.

- The college creates a culture of instilling and nurturing creativity and temper among the learners through various academic activities like seminar, workshop, industrial visit, communication skills, and soft skills.

- The students are regularly updated with the latest website, e-books, online journals and magazines in their subject area.
- Special Classes are taken for the weak students to improve their knowledge.
- Feedback is collected twice regularly from the students and it is reviewed every semester.
- Forum is an open platform for the students to exhibit their talents, which is conducted by the Department of MBA and MCA.

- The teaching ability is tested based on their voice modulation, presentation, subject knowledge and correlation.
- The personal interview is conducted for the candidates based on the written test and the class room session marks.
- Along with the expert panel, the selection list of the candidates will be handed over to the college management.
- The management will issue the offer letter based on the rank list.
