- ➤ Necessary information like time table, reopening date etc is sent to the mobile number of the students/parents immediately.
- ➤ Soft skills, communication skills and aptitude training are given to the students to face the interview and get placed in various MNCs
- ➤ Honour the students with the cash award of Rs.2000/- for getting centum in the University examination.
- ➤ Our Department of Computer Science has developed software which is installed in our office computers for giving Bonafide Certificate, Bonafide Certificate for Bus pass concession, Study Certificate, No Objection Certificate, Fees Certificate [Income tax & Bank loan], Conduct Certificate, Attendance Certificate, and Course Completion Certificate, imprinted with the students' photograph for the benefit of the students.
- > Encourage them by providing the registration fee and Travelling Allowance for winning prizes in various intercollegiate meet & Seminars/Symposiums/Workshops etc.,.
- Award cash prizes of Rs 2000 for students who qualified in the professional auditing courses like CA, ICWA, and ACS.
